Dear New Orleans Rowing Club Friends,

Earlier this summer, I found myself in the middle of a long workout, preparing for the FISA World Rowing Masters Regatta. As most rowers can attest, your mind starts to wonder on those hot and humid afternoons. Some of us choose to use that time to think about our upcoming competition, the pile of work we've been putting off, and many other things to make the time go by faster. I certainly do those things, but sometimes I also like to take laughable stabs at deep philosophical questions.

This particular workout was tough because it was serving as a long recovery row after a week of very intense training for my upcoming race. When the seconds started to tick by slower, I asked myself; Is there such a thing as a "perfect race"?

You'd think after 11 years of being involved in the sport of rowing both as an athlete and a coach that I would have a half decent answer or maybe even experienced a perfect race myself. But, what I was really struggling with was the definition of "perfect." What does it mean to be perfect? Is perfect to me the same as perfect to someone else? This really got me thinking.

My initial reaction was yes, a perfect race is possible. It just takes the right person, with the right training, and the right mindset. But, what if my "perfect" race could have been better? How would I know? It then dawned on me that the only way to really know something is perfect is to challenge yourself over and over to make sure that you are truly giving it your all. So, that "perfect race" is really an ongoing process that never ends and requires a constant set of new challenges.

Looking back at 2018, NORC had a near perfect year. We hit just about every substantial goal we set, grew membership at all age levels, and had an incredibly positive energy. We also attended and raced in more regattas than the previous 3 decades combined, testing our speed and earning the respect of other clubs in the region. But, we can do better. We just have to set the bar high and trust that there is another gear we can hit together.

Moving to 2019, let's embrace this challenge on finding that "perfect race" and set even more challenging goals for NORC. We are standing at the doorstep of some pretty amazing things. Thank you again for an incredible 2018!

Masters Report

The New Orleans Rowing Club Master's Program showed great success across the board as it built upon the work from 2017. Our rowers participated in eight regattas across 43 events, bringing home multiple medals, one Challenge Trophy, and the recognition of a program that can hold it's own against any club in the country and the world!

The year started out with a single goal, bring the best Men's Eight to Head of the Hooch. After that, field as many medal-competitive boats as possible at any regatta we attend. We did this, and then some. Our Men's 4+ took home the Challenge Trophy at the first annual Fred King competition with Tulane University in April. Over the summer, we sent rowers to the Stonewall regatta, as well as the Chicago Sprints where medals were won. September saw the culmination of an intense 60-day training schedule for seven rowers at FISA World Rowing Masters where we took home 7 gold medals, including the final premier event Sunday, the Mixed Masters 8+. A quick turnaround for four rowers took them to Head of the Charles, and then two weeks later to Head of the Hooch, where every boat brought in a strong performance. Our men's 4+ and 8+ raced in the club division against college programs, and finished as the top club boat in each race, respectively.

Back on the Bayou, we had dozens of club rowers out each week, and hosted at least one visiting rower as well on our year-round water. They came from as far as Norway and the hospitality shown by our club continues to help build not only our own reputation but the reputation of the City of New Orleans as well. We even have visitors who come back now because they know they can get a solid row in while experiencing a unique vantage point of the city. Some of these rowers we met back on the race course at Regattas this year, forming friendships that help build our programs reach and impact.

Our program participated in a volunteer and fundraising opportunity with the Bayou St. John Foundation for Bayou Boogaloo, helping them run a successful event this spring while helping the club pay for our first boat trailer. This trailer has increased the flexibility of our club to travel, expanding our options for regattas in 2019.

Learn-to-Row, headed up by Michael Merwin, saw some important gains this year. We hosted our first Learn-to-Row corporate event for Lucid, a local Tech Company, as well as over 100 sessions with individual rowers, of whom over a dozen have joined the club. This is a great way to expose people to the athletic options available in this city and the beauty of Bayou St John.

In 2019, on the water, we look to expand our women's program, encourage and develop recreational rowers through Learn-to-Rows, and bring home a medal in the Mens 8+ from Head of the Hooch. Off the water we will continue to develop training programs by visiting Krewe de CrossFit, volunteer for events in the community, and continue our outreach with other programs to expand NORC influence in the rowing community.













Juniors Report

The NORC junior program took another big step forward in 2018. A new middle school program was introduced to support the growing demand for youth rowing in the City of New Orleans. The new program was led by NORC coaches, Emily Gass and Maggie Daly, who both bring significant athletic and coaching experience to the club. In total 15 middle school athletes took to the water during the fall season and the program will continue in 2019 with spring, summer, fall and winter seasons.

The NORC high school program also continued success in 2018 with more than 21 athletes participating in the spring and fall competitive rowing seasons. The High School program was led by NORC coaches, John Huppi, Hannah Huppi and Michael Merwin. Programmatically, the biggest change came from the introduction of winter training, a season that was previously left as recovery time for athletes to focus on schoolwork and other activities. NORC athletes are now expected to continue training from November to February in preparation for the spring racing season. All winter training sessions are held at the new Krewe Du Crossfit facility in Uptown, New Orleans.

Additionally, the high school team continued to attend regattas with a focus on racing against tougher competition in preparation for a run at bigger regattas in 2019. The following table shows the year to year growth of the junior team and success at regattas:

The NORC junior program also made significant relationships with local schools and rowing clubs. Of note, the team scheduled two dual regattas with the Rowing Club of the Woodlands (RCTW) during the spring and fall racing seasons and the club recruited a number of female athletes from the Louise S. McGehee School located in Uptown New Orleans. The club also initiated a few learn-to-row camps, including a dedicated session with local teens enrolled in the Live Oak Camp.

This Spring, NORC graduate, Brennan Suffern completed his studies at Holy Cross School and is now rowing for the U.S. Coast Guard Academy. Brennan made his collegiate racing debut at the Rumson Boat Race in Rumson, NJ and is sitting in the varsity second eight. Additionally, NORC graduate, Bennett Faust also saw racing action this fall as a sophomore and varsity first eight rower at the College of Charleston.

Finance Report

New Orleans Rowing Club's financial performance was monitored closely throughout the year to ensure we could meet our financial obligations and accomplish our goals. We ended the year with a positive cash balance and once again, there will be a 16.67% increase in membership dues for 2018.

New Orleans Rowing Club was able to pay off the outstanding balance for the rowing trailer a few weeks ahead of schedule. We are also in a position to pay off the remaining balance on the Wintech 4x/+ prior to the end of the 2018.

The club held an end-of-year fundraiser as part of a new campaign to raise funds for the continued growth of the NORC junior programs. All proceeds are earmarked to assist with the purchase of a new coxed eight and the purchase of new racks to store the club's eights.

In 2018, a stronger emphasis will be placed on the acquisition of more club equipment, including more sculling blades, a new eight, a new double, and a new coaching launch.
